Reflections ~ Reflexiones:

GOSPEL: LUKE 3: 10-18

Imagine that you are there, listening to John the Baptist in today's gospel. You hear him advising the people who have already expressed their sorrow for their sins. They are about to be baptized as a sign of their repentance. But they realize that they must also change their lives and avoid sin in the future.

Then the people wonder whether John might be the promised Messiah of God. John tells them that they must look for someone greater than he. We know that he was directing them to Jesus.

We can be like John the Baptist when we help others to find Jesus Christ in their lives. Pray today that your joy in knowing Christ will help lead others to him.

- 1.) Did you know that the name John means "gift of God"?
- 2.) How was John the Baptist a gift to the people of his time? What gifts did he bring to them?
- 3.) Think of people who are gifts in your life. Do not forget those who, like John the Baptist, remind you to live as a just and peaceful person! Pray for those people. You may want to write them a note, if possible, to thank them for the gifts they bring to you.

EVANGELIO: LUCAS 3: 10-18

Pastor's Message ~ Mensaje del Párroco:

THE LORD IS NEAR

Historical records indicate that the birthday of our Savior was not celebrated in any significant way for at least the first three centuries of the church's existence. Nowadays, Christmas is considered the most important holiday in the year, and for reasons that have gone far beyond its true religious significance. Many of our most treasured customs, such as the decorated tree, greeting cards, and the exchange of Christmas presents, only date back to just over a century ago. Christmas has become more complicated ever since. Now, with changing times, many of us have begun to refocus not only *why* we celebrate Christmas, but *how*, so as to be in harmony with the meaning of Christ's birth. Saint Paul assures us that "The Lord is near" (Philippians 4:5) and urges us to stop our worrying, knowing that God will bring the gift of peace to our hearts, a peace beyond human understanding. Like the crowds surrounding John the Baptist in today's Gospel, we may say, "What should we do?" (Luke 3:10). John's answer holds true today: Share with others, act justly, and be satisfied with what we have. Only then can "Emmanuel" truly be, as the name means, "God with us." Important Message from Archbishop Salvatore J. Cordileone

STOP Assisted Suicide in CA before it's too late! Earlier this year, through a Special Session, the CA legislature passed into law assisted suicide, allowing doctors to prescribe overdoses of medication to terminally-ill patients. Join a coalition of physicians, nurses, disability-rights organizations, and people of all faiths to stand-up for the lives of our elderly and dying and oppose assisted suicide. On Sundays, throughout the rest of this year, referendum petitions will be available for signatures outside of Masses. Signers must be registered to vote and can only sign once.

Why Oppose Assisted Suicide?

- **Sends the Wrong Message:** Legalizing suicide for the terminally ill, while discouraging it for the rest of the population, teaches that the lives of the ill and disabled do not matter to our society.
- **Will Worsen Patient Care:** Patients in other states where assisted suicide has become law are being denied treatment prescribed by their doctors and instead offered drugs for assisted suicide.
- **Will Increase Non-Terminal Suicide Rates:** Suicides skyrocket when assisted suicide is legalized. Oregon's suicide rate for non-terminal people increased 49% after assisted suicide became legal.

Mensaje importante del Arzobispo Salvatore J. Cordileone

¡DETENGAMOS EL SUICIDIO ASISTIDO antes de que sea demasiado tarde! A principios de este año en una sesión especial de los legisladores de California se aprobó la ley que permite a los doctores prescribir sobredosis de medicamentos a pacientes que sufren de enfermedades terminales. Por favor únase a doctores, enfermeras, organizaciones que defienden los derechos de los discapacitados y a personas de todas las religiones para apoyar a los ancianos y a los moribundos oponiéndose a la ley del suicidio asistido. A partir de este domingo y hasta el fin de año podrán firmar las peticiones a la salida del templo. Deben de estar registrados para poder votar.

¿Por qué oponerse al Suicidio Asistido? Porque da el mensaje equivocado:

Aunque no se recomienda al resto de la población legalizar el suicidio asistido para los enfermos terminales, enseñar que la vida de los ancianos y los discapacitados no son importantes para nuestra sociedad.

Porque va a empeorar el cuidado de pacientes: A los pacientes en estados en donde ha sido aprobado el suicidio asistido se les está ofreciendo drogas que les facilitarán el suicidio.

Porque aumentará el suicidio de personas que no padecen de enfermedades terminales: Suicidios han aumentado en estados donde se ha legalizado. Por ejemplo, los suicidios de personas que NO sufrían de enfermedades terminales en Oregon incrementaron en un 49% desde que la ley del suicidio asistido pasó.

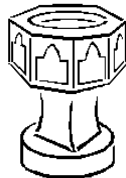

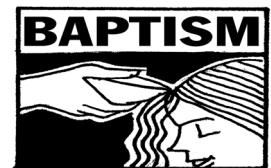
