GOSPEL: LUKE 13:1-9

Sometimes when we see a terrible accident or hear about people who are being persecuted, we may think that such things will never happen to us. Some people in Jesus' time believed that those who suffered such tragedies and injustices were being punished because they were great sinners. Jesus sets them straight in today's gospel reading. He says that suffering comes from injustice in our world.

- 1.) The season of Lent doesn't last forever. We need to turn toward God's reign right away if we are to truly celebrate Easter. How will you show that you have heard Jesus' words about reforming your life?
- 2.) The parable of the fig tree reminds us that God is patient, too. He is willing to help us, as the man was willing to give the tree extra help so that it would grow. How do you need God to help you in order to change your life for the better?
- 3.) If God gives you another year of life, what do you want to be like a year from now?

EVANGELIO: LUCAS 13: 1-9

Pastor's Message ~ Mensaje del Párroco:

FRUITFUL OR PRODUCTIVE?

"Yes," said Joel, "I'm hooked on productivity. I run a business, and we have young children. My days are packed." Joel's thinking was challenged at a men's retreat. The leader asked, "Do you think Jesus had a daily to-do list? ('Three people healed today. Two fast comebacks to the scribes and Pharisees. One really great parable told and dinner for 5,000. Well done, me')." Joel listened intently. "Jesus spoke wisely with mercy and grace. He occasionally retreated from crowds, yet when he was with people, he was really with them and loved them well. But was he productive? Productivity can become a mind-set of being busy as a lifestyle. Productivity seeks what fruitfulness claims as its starting point—the assurance of God's presence and love." Fruitfulness, Joel saw, allows you to be fully present in the moment. Fruitfulness is rooted in God's grace, requiring trust in the Holy Spirit, like compost around the fig tree in today's Gospel. The Spirit works at all times and places and, if we allow it, is at work in us—busy or not.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION:

Ash Wednesday is not observed by Eastern Christians, perhaps because, at least in Orthodox practice, weekdays are not proper days for the Divine Liturgy. Typically, "Great Lent" has a bit of a prelude. On "Meatfare Sunday" the faithful have their last chance to eat meat for the entire period of Great Lent. A week later, "Cheesefare Sunday" has dairy on the menu for the last time until *Pascha* (Easter). At twilight on Cheesefare Sunday, officially called "Sunday of Forgiveness," the church gathers for "Forgiveness Vespers." The faithful identify with Adam and Eve, forgiving one another in order to experience God's forgiveness. The desire to set aside all bitterness, and to achieve harmony and reconciliation in the family and with one's neighbors gives a remarkable energy to the transition into the days of penitence. At the end of the vespers liturgy, the décor of the church is changed to reflect the new season.

How is your Lenten fast going? Imagine the Eastern tradition. No meat, no fish, no dairy, no wine or oil. Some traditions permit vegetable oil; everyone goes without olive oil. Happily, strict fasting is not permitted on the Sabbath or the Lord's Day, so on Saturday and Sunday the fast is somewhat mitigated, and wine and oil are allowed. If the Feast of the Annunciation falls during Great Lent, then fish may be served. —Rev. James Field, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

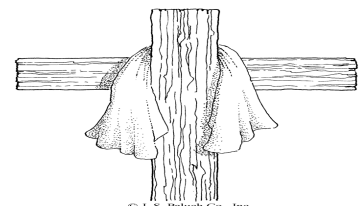

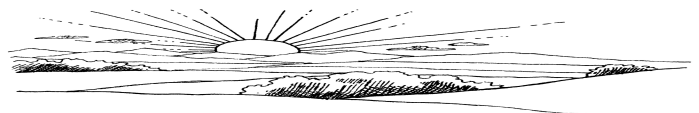
