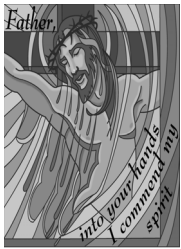

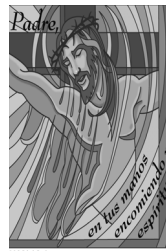
GOSPEL: LUKE 22: 14-23 :56 [1-49]



Today is called both Palm Sunday and Passion Sunday. Since the early centuries of the Church, Christians have carried palm branches in joyful processions on this day. We sing or shout, "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord" like the crowd that followed Jesus into Jerusalem at the beginning of what we now call Holy Week. This year we hear the passion account from Luke's Gospel. It tells a moving story of Jesus, who consoles the "good criminal" and forgives those who nailed him to the cross.

1.) Jesus' friends and acquaintances "stood at a distance." Sometimes, when we go through hard times, our friends and acquaintances also keep their distance! However, Jesus was not left alone. The thief and the centurion, who had never met him before, were there with him. They believed in him. Sometimes encouragement comes from people we least expect.

EVANGELIO: LUCAS 22: 14-23 56: [1-49]

Pastor's Message ~ Mensaje del Párroco:

TAKE UP YOUR CROSS

Father Oscar Romero was a timid, middle-level church bureaucrat in El Salvador. He silently complied with the wealthiest Salvadorians, who condemned all efforts to help the poor. Under their orders, the military were free to brutalize and kill anyone who got out of line. Romero was named Archbishop of San Salvador in 1977. He neither intervened in nor protested at the violence. Then came a turning point: along with two companions, a priest the Archbishop knew personally was killed. Romero started asking questions and became a marked man. He presented the Pope with reports detailing human rights abuses in El Salvador. In 1980, as Romero was celebrating Mass, he said. "Those who surrender to the service of the poor through love of Christ will live like the grain of wheat that dies . . . The harvest comes because of the grain that dies." He was killed with a single sniper shot to the heart. To put other people first is to serve Christ himself, regardless of the risk. Copyright © 2009, World Library Publications. All rights reserved.

CARGA CON TU CRUZ

El padre Oscar Romero era un sacerdote tímido y hasta cierto punto un burócrata eclesialístico en El Salvador. Calladamente era solícito con los salvadoreños adinerados, los cuales condenaban todos los esfuerzos en ayuda de los pobres. Bajo las órdenes de esos ricos, los militares brutalizaban y mataban libremente a cualquiera que se saliera de la línea. A Romero lo nombran arzobispo de San Salvador en 1977 y nunca protesta ni interviene contra la violencia. Entonces llega su momento decisivo: Junto a dos compañeros más, un sacerdote que Romero conocía personalmente fue asesinado. Romero comenzó a cuestionar las cosas y se convirtió en un hombre señalado. Le presentó al papa reportes que detallaban los abusos contra los derechos humanos en El Salvador. En 1980, Romero se expresó así durante una Misa que celebraba: "Los que se entregan al servicio de los pobres por amor de Cristo vivirán como el grano de trigo que muere . . . La cosecha se da por el grano que muere . . ." Fue asesinado por un francotirador con una sola bala al corazón. Treasures From Our Tradition:

What day is today? Ask most folks strolling home from church today and they will reply "Palm Sunday." Not too long ago, today was known as the "Second Sunday of the Passion," and in 1970 it was renamed "Passion Sunday." This made some sense, since the procession recalling Christ's entry into Jerusalem is usually only celebrated once in a parish on this day, but the Passion is proclaimed solemnly at every liturgy. In its most recent incarnation, the name for this day includes both aspects of the celebration: "Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord." In the United States today, most worshippers are provided with palm branches, although in northern Europe pussy willows are favored, and in Italy olive branches are the norm.

When our calendar was reformed, the entire structure of the week to come was revised even as the traditional name, "Holy Week," was retained. The major benefit of the restructuring of our calendar is to help us see that the Triduum, the great three days beginning at sunset this Thursday and extending until sunset on Easter Sunday, is at the heart of the Christian life.

Today, as you ponder the Lord's Passion, you may consider your response to so great a gift. Centuries ago, good Christians vowed to go on pilgrimage to Jerusalem. Today, at least once in your lifetime, promise to participate faithfully in the liturgies. Now begins the Church's annual baptismal retreat: don't be left out. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

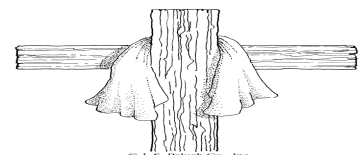

Passion:

The word "passion" connotes deep, focused engagement. It also relates to passivity, interestingly. The deeply passionate person in the Gospel narrative from Luke is Jesus. He appears passive, but he is not. He is wholly self-possessed and wholly present for the one day that begins on Thursday evening at his last meal with his apostles and ends with his burial before sunset the next day. Then follows the long Sabbath silence.

The narrative of the Passion is read whole and without pause on the Palm Sunday of the Passion. This story, found in each of the Gospels, is unchanging. We are the ones who change. Each year, we bring ourselves with another year's history to hear and heed the story we so badly need. Life has its way with us, and we look again to the Passion narratives to learn to follow.
