GOSPEL: JOHN 10: 27-30



The words Jesus speaks in this reading were directed to some Jewish leaders who wanted to trip him up. They were hoping he would call himself the Messiah. Instead, Jesus refers to himself as "the Good Shepherd." He describes the secure and lasting relationship he has with his sheep, those who truly hear him and believe. Just as no one can separate Jesus and his Father, no one can take Jesus' disciples away from him.

1.) What can you do this week to show that you have truly heard the Good Shepherd's voice?

Pastor's Message ~ Mensaje del Párroco:

EVERYDAY HEROES

We hear today how the Jews of Antioch rejected the preaching of Paul and Barnabas, who left to take their message elsewhere. The apostles felt compelled by their experiences of the risen Jesus to take his Good News as far as possible. Their intense love of the Lord and their desire to do God's will sent them on journeys throughout Mediterranean lands. They were jeered at, flogged, imprisoned, and shipwrecked. Some, including Peter and Paul, were martyred. "That was then," you might say "and this is now. I won't ever be martyred." But martyrdom is not necessarily physical death; the word means "to witness." Think of the elderly man caring for his wife with Alzheimer's, the parents of an autistic child, the single mother whose teenage son is disabled. These are witnesses to the value of another's good above their own. They lay down their life daily for someone else. This kind of martyrdom is intended to be a thread through all our lives. We choose whether our kindness, good words, and thoughtful deeds reflect God's love to others. God does not demand this, but we can demand it of ourselves. From all that God gives us, let us give back in kind.

HÉROES DE TODOS LOS DÍAS

Hoy escuchamos cómo los judíos de Antioquía rechazaron la prédica de Pablo y Bernabé, quienes se fueron a llevar su mensaje a otros lugares. Después de sus experiencias con Jesús resucitado, los apóstoles se sintieron obligados a llevar la Buena Nueva de su Maestro tan lejos como les fuera posible. El intenso amor que sentían por el Señor y el deseo de hacer la voluntad de Dios hicieron que viajaran hasta las tierras del Mediterráneo. Burlas, azotes, encarcelamientos y naufragios fueron parte de esos viajes. Algunos de los apóstoles, incluso Pedro y Pablo, fueron martirizados. Podrías decir: "Eso fue entonces, pero hoy es otra cosa. Nunca moriré mártir". Puede que no, pero el martirio no se trata necesariamente de una muerte física; la palabra significa "dar testimonio". Piensa en el anciano que cuida a su esposa con Alzheimer, los padres de un niño autista, la madre soltera cuyo hijo está discapacitado. Todas estas personas dan testimonio del valor que tiene poner el bienestar de otros por encima del propio bienestar, pues diariamente entregan su vida por otra persona. Esta clase de martirio es la fibra que debe predominar en la vida de cada uno de nosotros. Es decisión nuestra que toda gentileza, toda palabra bondadosa, toda atención para con los demás reflejen el amor de Dios para todos. Dios no exige eso de nosotros, pero nosotros podemos exigirnoslo. Demos de corazón y desinteresadamente de todo lo que Dios primero nos ha dado.

In response to Pope Francis' call to "place the Sacrament of Reconciliation at the center once more in such a way that it will enable people to touch the grandeur of God's mercy with their own hand," here are the parish confession times for the Year of Mercy:

Treasures From Our Tradition:

Just as the early church consecrated women living alone in the world, today that consecration is available to women who take solemn vows as cloistered nuns (different from religious sisters), women who follow a way of life in communities called "secular institutes," and laywomen. Oddly, the ritual is not permitted for religious sisters. The prayers talk about the woman's self-gift to Christ, and her self-gift to the Church. Up until recent years, this was a solemn ceremony performed only for cloistered nuns under certain circumstances. In its new form, we have a ritual that revives a very ancient and little-known way of life. Today, a woman can live independently at home, without association with any religious sisterhood or institute, yet be consecrated to holiness and service. Normally, a ring and/or a veil may be given in the liturgy of consecration. It is a rite very different from religious profession, where the sister makes promises or vows, and is rather an expression of approval and blessing for a way of life already embraced. Unlike ancient times, which valued actual virginity, the new rite may be celebrated for anyone provided there has never been a marriage and the woman has always lived a virtuous life.

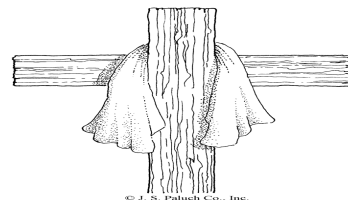

Jubilee Year of Mercy:

Good Shepherd Sunday: World Day of Prayer for Vocations

This Sunday celebrates Jesus as "the Good Shepherd." When announcing this *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, Pope Francis focused on Jesus' "lost sheep" parable in Luke. "[Who] among you," Jesus asks, "having a hundred sheep and losing one of them would not leave the ninety-nine in the desert and go after the lost one until he finds it?" (Luke 15:4). A reasonable answer? Jesus considers *one* lost person supremely important and suggests blaming the shepherd. The sheep didn't "go astray," the shepherd "lost" it. Thus, "when he does find it, he sets it on his shoulders with great joy" (15:5). That tender image of Jesus adorns the simple cross Pope Francis has always worn, the Good Shepherd gently carrying the lost sheep home on his shoulders. During this *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, may we, who once were lost ourselves but now are found, join Jesus in seeking, finding, and gently carrying home at least one precious lamb. —Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J. THE SHEPHERD'S FLOCK:

In Christian art, the earliest depictions of Jesus Christ were not of his crucifixion or of his resurrection. The first known renderings of Jesus show him as the Good Shepherd, the image put before us in today's readings. In the Gospel passage Jesus reveals that he is the shepherd and his followers are his "flock."

In the first and second readings, we are told more about the flock. The passage from Acts assures us that both Jews and Gentiles are called to follow Jesus. It is faith, not birthright, that makes us part of the company of believers. In the passage from the book of Revelation we learn that the flock that follows this Lamb of God will also be washed in his blood. They will endure a time of trial before they enjoy eternal life. TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE:

El 25 de abril la Iglesia conmemora a Pedro de Betancur (1626–1667). Originalmente de las Islas Canarias, a la edad de 24, se trasladó a Cuba. En 1651 llegó a Guatemala con la ambición de predicar a Cristo. Esto lo hizo, no como sacerdote ni religioso. El fue como laico, reconociendo su deber bautismal de evangelizar.

En 1655 ingresó en la Orden Seglar Franciscana y como laico quiso poner en práctica la espiritualidad franciscana, ayudando a los pobres. Con su propio pan o casa el alimentaba al hambriento y amparaba al indigente. A todos recordaba la necesidad de la salvación y en la simplicidad de su mensaje derretía el egoísmo de los ricos. Les abría el corazón enseñándoles a compartir con los más pequeños de sus hermanos y hermanas.

Eventualmente su nobleza de espíritu atrajo a hombres y mujeres que deseaban compartir su apostolado y fundó la Orden Betlehemita. También fundó la primera escuela de niños en Centro América convirtiéndose en el alfabetizador de Guatemala. Así dio ejemplo de lo que la Iglesia debe hacer por el pobre y marginado.

Año Jubilar de la Misericordia:

Domingo del Buen Pastor: Jornada Mundial de Oración por las Vocaciones

Este domingo se celebra a Jesús como “el Buen Pastor”. Cuando el Papa Francisco anunció este *Año Jubilar de la Misericordia*, se meditó a Jesús en la parábola de Lucas de “la oveja perdida”, “¿Qué hombre de ustedes, si tiene cien ovejas y una de ellas se pierde, no deja las noventa y nueve en el campo y va tras la que está perdida hasta que la encuentra?” (Lucas 15:4). ¿Cuál sería una posible respuesta? “Un pastor responsable que quiera cuidar su buen nombre”. Sin embargo, Jesús considera a *una* persona que esté perdida, sumamente importante y sugiere culpar al pastor. La oveja no “se extravió”, el pastor la “perdió”. Así que “al encontrarla, la pone sobre sus hombros, gozoso” (15:5). Esa es la imagen compasiva de la cruz pectoral que usa el Papa Francisco, el Buen Pastor llevando sobre sus hombros a la oveja perdida a casa. Durante este *Año Jubilar de la Misericordia*, que nosotros, que también nosotros estuvimos perdidos pero fuimos encontrados, unámonos a Jesús a buscar, encontrar y llevar con cuidado a casa al menos a una oveja perdida. —Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J. Second Reading — John envisions a great white-robed multitude standing before the throne and before the Lamb. (Revelation 7:9, 14b-17).

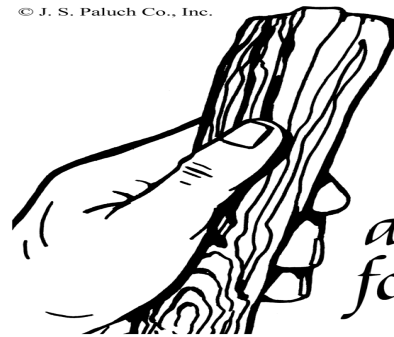
