Reflections ~ Reflexiones:

GOSPEL: JOHN 20: 19-23 OR 14:15-16 23B-26

Once again we are reliving Easter night with Jesus and the disciples. He breathes on them, communicating the gift of the Holy Spirit. They gladly receive Jesus' Spirit and his ministry of forgiving sins. At Pentecost the Spirit will send them forth as living signs that Jesus has overcome sin and death.

1.) Forgiveness is not "forgiving and forgetting." It does not deny that a wrong or a hurt took place. When we hurt someone, the bridge between us falls down. Our bond with that person is broken. When we forgive someone, or are forgiven, we allow the Holy Spirit to rebuild the bridge between us, even stronger than before. Because we are limited and human, we may not feel this all at once. But forgiveness is part of God's love. When we forgive, we bring God's love into our lives and into the lives of those who have hurt us. We can cross the bridge to meet again. We may still remember being hurt, but we can recall it with thanksgiving. We can thank God for the new and stronger bridge. Are there any broken bridges in your life? What might be a first step to the Spirit's gift of rebuilding and repair? How could you ask the Holy Spirit for help?

EVANGELIO: JUAN 20: 19-23 O 14: 15-16 23B-26

Una vez más estamos reviviendo la noche de resurrección con Jesús y sus discípulos. El sopló sobre ellos, comunicándoles el don del Espíritu Santo. 1.) Perdonar no es "perdonar y olvidar". No es negar que pasó algo malo o que una ofensa tuvo lugar. Cuando ofendemos a alguien, el puente entre las dos personas cae. Se rompe el lazo con esa persona. Cuando perdonamos a otro, o somos perdonados, permitimos al Espíritu Santo reconstruir el puente entre nosotros, más fuerte de lo que era antes. Porque somos limitados y humanos, puede que sintamos todo eso. Pero el perdón es parte del amor de Dios. Cuando perdonamos, traemos el amor de Dios a nuestras vidas y a las vidas de los que nos han ofendido. Podemos cruzar el punto y encontrarnos de nuevo. Puede que recordemos la ofensa, pero podemos recordar con agradecimiento. Podemos dar gracias a Dios por un punto nuevo y más fuerte. ¿Hay algún puente roto en tu familia? ¿Cuál sería el primer paso hacia los dones de reparación y reconstrucción del Espíritu? ¿Cómo puedes pedir ayuda al Espíritu Santo?

As adults we can become solemn and even anxious about faith, taking ourselves much too seriously. We may think we have to be perfect before God can use us or make a home in our hearts. Today we remember Pentecost when, as promised, the power of the Holy Spirit was poured out onto the apostles. We do not have to be perfect for the Spirit to fill us. Remember this widely-distributed list of unlikely characters: *Adam* was a coward. *Noah* was a drunk. *Sarah* was too old. *Isaac* was a day-dreamer. *Jacob* was a liar. *Joseph* was abused. *Moses* had a stuttering problem. *Gideon* was afraid. *Rahab* was a "lady of the evening." *Jeremiah* was too young. *David* had an affair and was a murderer. *Isaiah* preached naked. *Jonah* ran from God. *Naomi* was a widow. *Job* went bankrupt. *John the Baptist* ate bugs. *Peter* denied Christ—three times. *Martha* worried about everything. *Three Apostles* fell asleep while praying. *Mary Magdalene* was mentally ill. The *Samaritan woman* was divorced—more than once. *Zaccheus* was too small. *Paul* was too religious. *Timothy* had an ulcer and *Lazarus* was dead!

In response to Pope Francis' call to "place the Sacrament of Reconciliation at the center once more in such a way that it will enable people to touch the grandeur of God's mercy with their own hand," here are the parish confession times for the Year of Mercy:

Monday - 5:30-6:30 pm

Saturdays - 4:00 - 5:00 pm

Sundays (Spanish ONLY) after the 11:30am mass.

Treasures From Our Tradition:

"Order" and "presbyter" are not everyday words in our vocabulary, since we think of order as a quality of life rather than a collective noun, and "priest" usually does just fine in everyday conversation. Yet each word has deep roots in our tradition. At an ordination we select men for service to the community.

Ordo is a Latin word drawn not from pagan religious life but from Imperial Rome. It meant a distinct body standing apart from the people, such as a body of people responsible for civil governance, senators for example. Think of the selectmen or board of governors in your civic home, and you will get the idea. The church borrowed the term to describe the place of certain people within the people of God, thus the "order of deacons," "the order of presbyters," and even "the order of virgins, catechumens, widows, neophytes, penitents," and so on, as distinct groups within the church.

Just as ancient Rome had various uniforms for the ranks and stations in civil life, so too did certain garments give clues to membership in an "order" in the church. So, our tradition favors the idea of an ordination liturgy not as receiving something so much as being received. This is clearly expressed in the liturgy. The "kiss of peace" is given only by the ordaining bishop and priests to the newly "ordained," not by the faithful, the deacons, or the concelebrating bishops who are present —Rev. 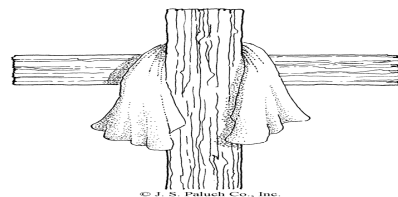

Solemnity of Pentecost:

Announcing the *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, Pope Francis challenged us to proclaim God's mercy "to everyone without exception . . . again and again, with new enthusiasm and renewed pastoral action" (*Misericordiae Vultus*, 12). Pentecost proclaims that the door locked for fifty days is thrown open at last. No longer closed in on itself, the community speaks to crowds from different backgrounds, distant lands, exotic languages. Everyone hears their native language. The Spirit does not restore Babel's uniformity, but forges unity-in-diversity of language, race, nationality—embracing all without exception. During this *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, Pentecost's Spirit summons us afresh from mediocrity and isolation to share God's mercy with the world. "This is our mission!" Francis exclaims. We are "given the gift of the 'tongue' of the Gospel and the 'fire' of the Holy Spirit, so that while we proclaim Jesus risen, living and present in our midst, we may warm . . . the heart of the peoples, drawing near to Him, the way, the truth, and the life" (*Regina Coeli* address, Pentecost Sunday, May 24, 2015).

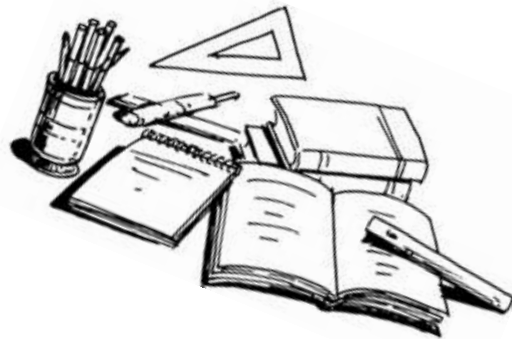
Año Jubilar de la Misericordia:

Solemnidad de Pentecostés
Al anunciar el *Año Jubilar de la Misericordia* el Papa Francisco nos desafía a proclamar la misericordia de Dios "a todos, sin excluir ninguno . . . una vez más con nuevo entusiasmo y con una renovada acción pastoral" (*Misericordiae Vultus*, 12). Pentecostés proclama que la puerta cerrada por cincuenta días finalmente se abre. No más encierro en sí misma, la comunidad habla a las multitudes con diferentes orígenes, de tierras lejanas, exóticos lugares. Cada uno los escucha en sus lenguas nativas. El Espíritu no restaura la uniformidad de Babel, pero fragua la unidad en la diversidad del idioma, de la raza, de la nacionalidad, incluyendo a todos sin excepción. Durante este *Año Jubilar de la Misericordia*, el Espíritu de Pentecostés nos convoca de nuevo desde la mediocridad y la soledad para compartir la misericordia de Dios con el mundo. "¡Esta es nuestra misión!" lo dice el Papa Francisco. "Se nos dio el don del 'idioma' del Evangelio y el 'fuego' del Espíritu Santo, para proclamar a Jesús resucitado, vivo y presente en medio de nosotros y para alentar los corazones de las personas, acercándolas a Jesús, el Camino, la Verdad y la Vida" (*Rezo del Regina Coeli, Domingo de Pentecostés, 24 de mayo de 2015*).

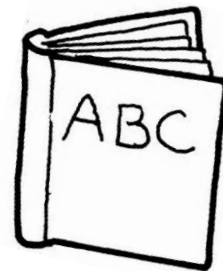
