Reflections ~ Reflexiones:

GOSPEL: LUKE 9: 51-62

Jesus is on his way to Jerusalem. He is preparing himself to face suffering and death. He forgives the Samaritans who refuse to welcome him, showing his disciples how to behave toward their enemies. He then responds to three different people who want to follow him. Does he say, "Come with me and all will be well?" Not at all. Jesus tells them right up front that the cost of becoming his disciple is high. That cost may include giving up home, family, and means of income.

1.) There are many ways of following Jesus. Some followers of Jesus today still give up "home, family, and means of income." Do you know anyone who has? We usually think of those in religious vows, like priests, sisters, and brothers. Find out about the priests, sisters, and brothers who serve in your parish or diocese. Some lay people also join together to follow Jesus as missionaries and helpers to the poor. They serve for one or more years in this country and in places around the world. Others join religious orders as Associate Members, but do not take vows or live in community. They may be married or single. Find out about some lay organizations that do this. Here are some examples: Maryknoll Lay Associates, Jesuit Volunteer Corps, Associates of the Divine Compassion.

EVANGELIO: LUCAS 9: 51-62

Jesús va camino a Jerusalén. Se está preparando para enfrentar el sufrimiento y la muerte. 1.) Hay muchas formas de seguir a Jesús. Algunos de sus seguidores hoy continúan dejando "hogares, familias e ingresos". ¿Conoces a alguien que haya hecho esto? Generalmente pensamos en los religiosos, por ejemplo los sacerdotes, las monjas y los hermanos religiosos. Investiga sobre los sacerdotes, religiosas y religiosos en tu parroquia o en tu diócesis. Algunos laicos también se unen para seguir a Cristo como misioneros y ayudan a los pobres. Sirven aquí y en otros lugares alrededor del mundo. Investiga sobre algunas organizaciones de laicos que hacen este trabajo: Maryknoll Lay Associates, Jesuit Volunteer Corps.

MIXED MESSAGE

Words are funny things. Over time they can change meaning. Take diversity. It used to mean opposite, different. Humans reactions to difference range from suspicion to violence. As our world has shrunk we try to make diversity into a positive thing. One Catholic parish, with many new Spanish and Vietnamese parishioners, described diversity in glowing terms in its mission statement. A parishioner commented that as actually practiced there, diversity still meant separate activities in worship, faith formation, community involvement, and giving. Some parishioners said to the pastor: "Those people don't give their fair share" (meaning money). Saint Paul calls this "biting and devouring one another" (Galatians 5:15). He reminds us that the greatest commandment is to love our neighbor as ourselves. That's a challenge when we find it difficult to get along with family and friends. Mas, debido a que nuestro mundo se ha achicado, tratamos de hacer de la diversidad algo positivo. Una parroquia católica con muchos nuevos miembros hispanos y vietnamitas describió la diversidad en términos elogiosos al escribir su declaración de misión. Un parroquiano comentó que en la práctica la diversidad en la parroquia aun significaba actividades separadas en la liturgia, la formación de fe, los esfuerzos comunitarios y la colecta. In response to Pope Francis' call to "place the Sacrament of Reconciliation at the center once more in such a way that it will enable people to touch the grandeur of God's mercy with their own hand," here are the parish confession times for the Year of Mercy:

Treasures From Our Tradition:

An old and still vital treasure in our tradition is a document called the "Apostolic Traditions," giving us a snapshot of church life in third-century Rome. Its author, Hippolytus, describes the liturgical life of the church and records the actual texts of the prayers. The way he explained the various "orders" of the church was the basis for a major reform of the rites of ordination by Pope Pius XII in 1947, and later for the Second Vatican Council. Hippolytus tells us that a bishop had to be elected by the entire people, and that ordination had to take place on a Sunday in the presence of the people, the presbyters, and neighboring bishops. The bishop-candidate is ordained by the other bishops, who impose their hands on his head while everyone else keeps a profound silence, awaiting the outpouring of the Spirit. There is a prayer of blessing said by one of them, on behalf of all, asking for the Spirit and describing his ministry.

Later centuries layered new features on top of this liturgy, including the requirement for three bishop consecrators. Today, whenever a new bishop is announced (election by the people is no more), a kind of genealogy is provided, tracing his pedigree through the consecrating bishops down through the centuries to Peter and the first body of believers. Every bishop today can trace his office through his consecrators back to the beginning in a tradition called "apostolic succession."

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time:

Yet again in Ordinary Time, Jesus seems to demand extraordinary commitment. A would-be disciple enthusiastically volunteers to follow Jesus wherever" (Luke 9:57). Jesus replies that "wherever" means "nowhere to rest his head" (9:58). To other candidates, Jesus brusquely denies reasonable requests to fulfill family obligations (9:59, 61), declaring that discipleship demands total commitment—now! But Jesus also demands that we not judge how others respond. When James and John volunteered to "call down fire from heaven" (9:54) to destroy an unwelcoming town, Jesus "turned and rebuked them" (9:55). All violence of any kind is completely unacceptable among Jesus' disciples, a lesson this *Jubilee Year of Mercy* is teaching the Christian community once again. Paul's challenge to the Galatians and us reinforces Jesus' decisive command to James and John that they express their commitment to him through compassion for others. We must abandon the violence of "biting and devouring one another" (Galatians 5:15), choosing instead to "serve one another through love" (5:13). —Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.

Decimotercer Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario:

En este, un domingo más del Tiempo Ordinario, parece que Jesús exige un compromiso extraordinario. Un aspirante entusiasmado a ser discípulo se ofrece de voluntario para seguir a Jesús "a donde sea" (Lucas 9:57). Jesús le contesta que "a donde sea" significa "no tener donde recostar la cabeza" (9:58). A otros aspirantes, Jesús bruscamente niega sus peticiones para seguirlo pues les antepone razonablemente sus responsabilidades y obligaciones familiares (9:59, 61), expresando que ahora ser discípulo exige compromiso completo. Pero Jesús también exige que no juzguemos cómo responden otras personas. Cuando Santiago y Juan se ofrecen para "hacer caer fuego del cielo" (9:54) para destruir una ciudad que no los recibió, Jesús "los reprende" (9:55). Cualquier tipo de violencia es completamente inaceptable entre los discípulos de Jesús, una lección este *Año Jubilar de la Misericordia* es enseñar una vez más a la comunidad cristiana. El desafío de Pablo a los gálatas y a nosotros refuerza el mandamiento decisivo de Jesús a Santiago y Juan que ellos expresaran su compromiso hacia los demás con compasión. Debemos dejar de ser violentos y dejar "comernos y devorarnos unos a otros" (Gálatas 5:15), eligiendo en su lugar "servir uno al otro por medio del amor" (5:13).
