Reflections ~ Reflexiones:

GOSPEL: LUKE 14: 25-33

Jesus is on his way to Jerusalem when he stops to give this no-nonsense talk to a great crowd of people who want to follow him. Like any rabbi of his time, Jesus uses exaggeration to command attention. He wants to get the point across that he must be at the center of his followers' lives. Jesus insists that no one can be his disciple who does not consider him before family or self. The disciple who thinks he or she can serve Jesus part-time is foolish. She is like a builder who has no idea how much it will cost to complete a tower. He is like a king who goes to battle with no idea how many troops his enemy has. The disciple must be willing to renounce or give up everything out of love for Christ.

1.) Do you choose Jesus each day in your life? Why or why not? How? How are you learning more about Jesus so that you can choose to follow him? How does your choice of following Jesus make life better for others in your family and among your friends? What are your responsibilities in life? How do you choose to carry them out?

EVANGELIO: LUCAS 14: 25-33

A él no le gusta el tipo de gente que va a la batalla sin tener una idea de cuanta cuantos soldados tiene el enemigo.

Pastor's Message ~ Mensaje del Párroco:

CHANGE OF HEART

Why does Jesus say we must hate parents, spouses, children to be his disciples? Scholars believe that Jesus was deliberately exaggerating to emphasize the point that human beings often cling to relationships and possessions, which come to occupy the place in their heart where God is meant to be, making true discipleship almost impossible. Think of these examples: the woman totally focused on her children, ignoring her husband; the man who spends evenings and weekends drinking; the hoarder compensating for loss or lack of relationships. Such displacements, if hardened into habit, can keep people from a life with God. Attending Mass regularly, frequent prayer, and keeping the commandments are excellent habits but do not bring us closer to God unless our hearts change to give God first place. This is true conversion—sometimes a dramatic process but more often a deliberate day-to-day effort to reorder how we live. Jesus first, others next, yourself last spells J-O-Y. Jesús sabe que, como seres humanos, a menudo nos aferramos a relaciones y posesiones, y quiere advertirnos que será casi imposible ser sus discípulos si esas cosas llegan a ocupar el lugar que debería tener Dios en nuestro corazón. Piensa en estos ejemplos: la mujer que pone toda su atención en sus hijos e ignora al esposo; el hombre que se pasa todas las tardes y fines de semana bebiendo; la persona que lo acapara todo como para compensar la pérdida o carencia de relaciones. Ir a Misa regularmente, orar con frecuencia y guardar los mandamientos son hábitos excelentes; pero no nos acercan a Dios, a no ser que Dios pase a ocupar de nuevo el primer lugar en nuestro corazón. Ésa es la verdadera conversión, que muchas veces podría realizarse drásticamente, pero por lo regular suele darse en el esfuerzo diario de reorganizar nuestra vida. Bible Study:

Bible Study was one of the topics presented in their 3-year program on renewing our faith and re-evangelization, and it was the topic that the evaluation surveys reflected what our parishioners were most interested in.

The Bible Study program will commence on Tuesday, September 6th, at 7:00-8:30pm and held in the Cafeteria. Please see the flyer posted in the bulletin or in the vestibule for scheduling times and subjects.

The first three subjects are DVD presentations by *Scripture from Scratch, St. Anthony Messenger Press*. The DVDs are lead-ins to the Bible Study program that define what the Bible is, the makeup of the Bible; how the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament) and Christian Scriptures (New Testament) complement each other. "One cannot understand Christianity without knowing its Jewish roots." Then starting October 11th and thereafter, Fr Cameron Faller will present the Gospel of Matthew containing its many parables (stories) for interpretation and application in our lives. The Bible Study will also allow time for questions and answers, and intimate group discussions. The Committee hopes the journey will be exciting as well as informative in your quest to learn the Bible, and to know our God and our Lord Jesus Christ.
