## GOSPEL: LUKE 17: 11-19

In this story of a miraculous healing, ten lepers cry out to Jesus for help. In Jesus' time, lepers were outcasts of society. Jesus tells them to go show themselves to the priests, who will witness their healed condition and allow them back into society. Only one leper, a Samaritan, returns to Jesus to praise and thank God. This man is not a Jew but a foreigner. Jesus points out that the Samaritan leper has gained something far more important than a physical cure; he has gained his eternal salvation.

1.) Did you ever wonder why the other nine lepers did not return to thank Jesus? Try to think of some reasons: one may have hurried back to his family; another may have meant to thank Jesus, but got busy with other things and forgot. Can you think of some other reasons? Do you always thank someone for a gift? Why or why not? How do you do it?

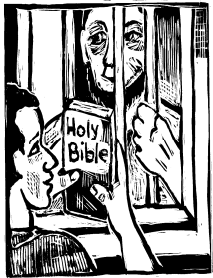
## EVANGELIO: LUCAS 17: 11-19

## **FREE OF FEAR**



In today's readings lepers are cured: one through the prophet Elisha and ten by Jesus. For centuries lepers were total outcasts, compelled to live apart with other sufferers. Death did not come quickly to lepers, and loneliness and hunger were often worse than the disease. They survived by begging. Imagine the joy of these sufferers who are suddenly made well, and who can now slip back into normal life. Only two of these lepers paused to offer thanks. Neither of them were "sons of Israel." Naaman at first tried to give the prophet Elisha a gift to show his gratitude, which Elisha refused. Both Naaman and the Samaritan in the Gospel realized that the power of the God of Israel had freed them, not only from their physical suffering, but also from the isolation and fear that went along with it. 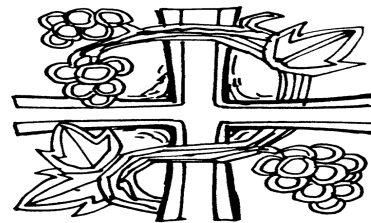

## **October Mass Count:**

Throughout the month of October we will be conducting our annual October Mass Count. This is the time of year where we count our parishioners (men, women and children) as a means of measuring the attendance in the parishes from year to year. These statistics are used for reporting to the various offices in Rome and others. Some funding and help is based on these statistics so we hope you will make yourself counted! The results will be reported in November.

## **TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

This month, parishes around the country will conduct the "October count," a measure of attendance at Sunday Mass. The measure has been taken for many centuries, and in some European dioceses it is possible to measure the level of engagement in worship by the population over the course of many centuries. Long ago, it was also the custom to track "Easter duty" by a statistical report. Penitents would receive a kind of chit at confession, which they would then turn in at their parish church when they received Holy Communion during Easter time.

Long ago, of course, Communion was fairly rare in the life of a Catholic Christian, perhaps only once a year. The chits would be tallied by parish priests and reported to the chancery, which in turn would hold on to the records and include the statistics in a report to the Vatican every five years. Nowadays, the October count has proved especially critical in the life of our Church as bishops use the figures to measure the vitality of church life, to sketch parish boundaries, and even to decide when to close, merge, or form new parishes.
