Reflections ~ Reflexiones:

GOSPEL: LUKE 18: 1-8

Just as our first reading was a victory story, so is the parable Jesus tells about the widow and the judge. A lowly widow comes before a judge, seeking her rights. The immoral judge ignores her, but the widow goes on pleading and nagging until he finally decides the case in her favor. He helps the widow not because he is good but because she is persistent. Jesus concludes that if a corrupt judge can do justice to someone who keeps on asking, God, the most just judge of all, will certainly listen to those who persist in prayer .

1.) The widow's first and last request was not for privilege but for justice. In his encyclical, "On the Development of Peoples," Pope Paul VI (who was the pope immediately before Pope John Paul II) urged all Catholics and all people of the world to work for both justice and peace. How can you work and pray for justice and peace in our time?

EVANGELIO: LUCAS 17: 11-19

Al igual que en la primer lectura leímos una historia victoriosa, así también es la parábola que Jesús nos cuenta sobre la viuda y el juez. Una viuda llegó ante el juez pidiendo justicia. El inmoral juez la ignora, pero ella sigue pidiendo y demandando hasta que finalmente el juez decide el caso en su favor. El ayuda a la viuda no porque es bueno sino por la persistencia de ella. Jesús concluye que si un juez corrupto puede hacer justicia con alguien que le pide y le pide, Dios, el juez más justo de todos, ciertamente que escuchará a los que persisten en la oración.

1.) El primer y ultimo deseo de la viuda no fué para pedir privilegios sino más bien para pedir justicia. En su encíclica: "En el desarrollo de las personas", el Papa Paulo VI (quien fue el papa que vino justo antes del Papa Juan Pablo II, pidió que todos oremos para que haya justicia y paz en el mundo. ¿Que puedo hacer para que haya paz y justicia en el mundo?

Pastor's Message ~ Mensaje del Párroco:

FOLDED HANDS

"All we can do now is pray." We often say this when human efforts have failed, but it puts God in the place of last resort. In the Gospels, Jesus tells his disciples pray first, next, and last. Don't wait; call on God now, cry to God, tell God your problems. Believe that God hears you and looks on you with love. All prayers are answered: God says "yes," "no," or "wait." Perhaps your friend with cancer needs reconciliation with a family member more than a cure. Maybe the job that fell through for your son was a wrong turn. Your children may return to the Church when they have children. God sees the bigger picture. Prayer is not supposed to persuade God to give us exactly what we want; rather it is a means to rest our concerns and desires in the heart of God, who will give us all we need. Start with folded hands and an attitude of trust.

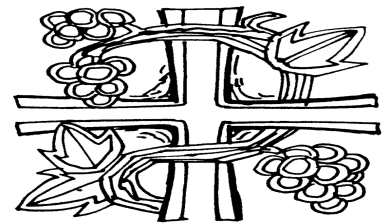

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

From the early medieval period, it was expected that the many bishops of Italy travel to Rome at least once every three years to give a report of their ministry, with a footnote granting the bishops of Sicily a visit every five years. By the eleventh century, the idea of bishops visiting the tombs of the apostles was a very strict requirement for all within reasonable reach of Rome. The age of discovery and the expansion of the Church into remote corners of the earth made this an unreasonable burden in many cases, yet every bishop was required at least to send a representative to Rome every five years.

In 1911, Pope St. Pius X established the rule for a "quinquennial" (meaning "once in five years") report, called an *ad limina*. This literally means "to the threshold," and refers to the expectation that the visiting bishop will go to the thresholds of the tombs of the apostles Peter and Paul and to a personal audience with the Holy Father. An exemption was given to so-called "mission territories," which in 1911 included the United States. The reports were still required, but could be filed by letter with an office of the missions called "Propagation of the Faith." This status was changed in 1917 and since that time all American bishops have been subject to the *ad limina*. These reports, carefully kept in the Vatican archives, are a treasure trove for historians, providing snapshots of culture and faith and a record of the Church's resilience even in times of persecution and change.

Después de haber pasado varios años como religiosa, se dio cuenta que su vida personal necesitaba conversión. Así fue que se puso a orar y practicar el recogimiento del alma. Ella confiesa que pasarían casi 15 años antes de que estas prácticas dieran fruto. Ella no se dejó vencer durante esos quince años y siguió insistiendo en la oración hasta que Dios le concedió visiones y visitas celestiales. Su mística llena de gozos celestiales nunca la separó de la tierra. Ella no se escondía en la oración, mas bien salía de la oración para luchar en el mundo. Ella inspiró la reforma carmelitana y sigue inspirándonos hoy con sus escritos.
