Reflections ~ Reflexiones:

Gospel: Mathew 3: 1-12

John the Baptist was one of those preachers who did not mind stepping on people's toes? even those of the rich and powerful. His mission was to get people to repent and be baptized before the Messiah arrived. John warns the religious leaders of his time that they must produce good fruit as proof of their conversion.

- 1.) John the Baptist seems to be a believer in the saying, "Actions speak louder than words." He tells the religious leaders of his day, "Give some evidence that you mean to reform."
- 2.) John wanted everyone to be ready for the Messiah: no excuses! How are you getting ready for the Messiah? Are your actions of justice, peace, and love speaking loud and clear as you prepare for Christmas? Are you really a follower of Christ or are you just jumping on the Advent-Christmas bandwagon? (A bandwagon is a wagon or "float" that carries the band in a parade. Someone who "jumps on the bandwagon" wants to be in the parade but doesn't want to do the hard walking. He or she just wants to ride along with the band and enjoy the music!) Take a few quiet moments and ask Saint John the Baptist to suggest something just, peaceful, and loving that you could do to prepare to celebrate Christmas as a true follower of Christ. Give some evidence that you mean to be ready! (You may want to join with a partner to do something special. The more the merrier!)

Evangelo: Mateo 3: 1-12

Juan el Bautista fue uno de esos predicadores a quien no le importaba caer mal, no importaba si fueran ricos y poderosos. Su misión fue pedir a la gente que se arrepintiera y se bautizara antes de la llegada del Mesías. Juan alertó a los líderes religiosos de su tiempo de que debían producir buenos frutos como prueba de su conversión.

- 1.) Parece que Juan el Bautista creía en el dicho: "Las acciones hablan mejor que las palabras". Dice a los líderes religiosos de su época: "Ofrezcan alguna evidencia de que en realidad se quieren reformar".
- 2.) Juan quiere que todo el mundo esté listo para recibir al Mesías, sin ninguna excusa. ¿Cómo te estás preparando para recibir el Mesías? ¿Hablan tus obras de justicia, paz y amor más claramente durante tu preparación para la Navidad? ¿Estás listo para seguir a Cristo o sólo estás trepado en el camión de Adviento-Navidad? Toma unos minutos en silencio y pide a San Juan Bautista te sugiera algo justo, amoroso o de paz que puedes hacer para prepararte para celebrar la Navidad como verdadero seguidor de Cristo. Ofrece evidencia de que estás listo. (puede que quieras unirte a un amigo para hacer algo especial.)

Pastor's Message ~ Mensaje del Párroco:

THE SOUND OF STILLNESS



Can you hear him above the busyness and noise? John the Baptist says we must change. A great light will expose our sinfulness and burn up what we cannot hide. We cannot be complacent. We must change, but how? Centuries ago a young man grew up in northern Africa. He received an excellent education, but fell in with a sect called the Manichees, who encouraged evil living. He prayed to God to change him, "but not yet." Finally, he faced his own emptiness and powerlessness and was quiet enough to hear the "still small voice." God said, "Take up and read." The scriptures fell open to the Letter to the Romans (13:13-14). His heart changed. His name is Augustine—a bishop, great Christian theologian, and doctor of the Church. TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION:

Did St. Francis of Assisi invent the Christmas crib? Not exactly, but his devotion to the Incarnation and his love for the poverty of the Christ Child certainly popularized this beloved custom. Long before Francis, it was a custom at the Basilica of St. Mary Major in Rome to enshrine a rich image of Mary, gilded and jeweled, embracing the child Jesus. This church was founded as a kind of home for the feast of Christmas in the fourth century. In 1223, Francis was ready to celebrate this feast in a new way. In the tiny city of Greccio, he asked friends to prepare a place where they could experience the poverty and suffering embraced by Christ in his birth. It was a living scene: an ox from the barn, an ass from the stable, and peasants standing in for shepherds and kings. The night of the celebration was beautiful, the weather was warm, and people came in crowds, bearing candles and singing hymns that echoed through the forest. Francis himself chanted the Gospel and preached. The custom spread quickly, and by the sixteenth century cribs were seasonal features not only in church, but in the home.

On December 17, the liturgy begins to unfold the Lord's birth before us, and it's the right time to follow this beautiful tradition. In Germany, each night throughout Advent children prepare a bedding for the manger. At bedtime prayer, a child places a single straw in the manger for each act of devotion or virtue performed during the day. If the children are good, then the Christ child will have plenty of soft bedding when he is placed in the manger on Christmas. —

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

El 8 de diciembre, la Iglesia celebra solemnemente la Inmaculada Concepción de María. A la vez, la Madre de Jesucristo es honrada en Venezuela bajo la advocación de Nuestra Señora de Coromoto, en Paraguay como Nuestra Señora de Caacupé, en Panamá como Nuestra Señora de La Antigua y en Nicaragua como Nuestra Señora del Viejo.

Esta última advocación tiene distintas historias que relatan su origen. Hay quienes dicen que pertenecía a un viejo ermitaño que viajaba con unos marinos. En cierto punto la imagen no quiso continuar el viaje y el barco no se movió hasta que se bajó el viejo con ella. Según otro relato, Nuestra Señora del Viejo fue traída a Nicaragua por Francisco de Ahumada, hermano de Teresa de Ávila. Francisco viajaba a América y su santa hermana quiso mandar tres imágenes marianas como regalo a los misioneros religiosos que estaban evangelizando en Guatemala, Perú y Nicaragua. Durante el año 1562, Francisco entregó la imagen de la Purísima a los Franciscanos de Nicaragua en el pueblo de "El Viejo", por lo cual los nicaragüenses han declarado por años que "El viejo nos trajo a la Conchita". Hay que saber que el viejo Francisco tenía 41 años de edad cuando pasó por Nicaragua.

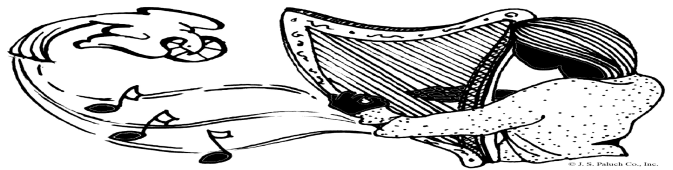
